



Confined Space - Vessel Entry

Overview

This is aimed at persons who may be required to enter confined spaces as part of their duties and may be called upon to wear breathing apparatus in an irrespirable atmosphere. By the end of the course the delegates will have the knowledge, skills and understanding to safely enter confined spaces and the understanding to safely wear breathing apparatus in hazardous atmospheres.
